

## Front 'V' Shaping for European 4 in 1 Necklace.



ValleyGem

Copper rings are used to show more clearly the ring positions that have been altered.



# 1.

Weave a piece of Euro 4 in 1 to the length needed for the necklace, find the middle of the necklace and mark the lower edge, I have used a pendant as a marker.

Note the ring on the top edge with a marker dot.



# 2.

Remove the ring with the marker dot from the top edge.

On the top edge open the ring with the marker +.



# 3.

Weave the open ring through the 2 marked rings to it's left, this ring now holds 3 rings.



# 4.

Close the ring containing 3 rings.

Open the 2 marked rings and remove them.



# 5.

Open the ring to the right of the spaces formed when the last 2 rings were removed.

Weave each ring through the three marked rings next to them as you did in #4 and close these 2 rings.



# 6.

3 rings have been removed, and 3 rings now each pass through 3 rings instead of 2.

The European 4 in 1 chain in these photos is woven using 5mm ID x 1mm rings.

The Sterling Silver bead in the pendant is a copy of an antique woven bead from the 18<sup>th</sup> Century or earlier, the original bead was lent to me so I could discover how it was made. As the bead came from Denmark I called the copy a Danish Knot.
